

### Plot 103

The names on the plot map are Margaret Brown and Mary A. Lowe. These graves are marked by the large Grant family tombstone in the party zone of Clark's Cemetery. This plot is completely full and needs to be restored to a place of dignity.

1. Alexander Grant was born in Scotland in 1806. He moved to Nova Scotia and was in Gloucester by 1855. He married Catherine Carmichael in 1806. He died in Gloucester on July 27, 1893.
2. Catherine Carmichael Grant was the daughter of Archibald and Isabel Carmichael. She was born in Scotland in 1806. She died in Gloucester of pneumonia and heart disease on November 30, 1880.
3. Elizabeth "Bessie" Grant was the daughter of Alexander and Catherine Grant. She was born in Cape Breton, Nova Scotia in 1846 and died of consumption in Gloucester on November 15, 1892.
4. Jessie J. Grant Rogers was the daughter of Alexander and Catherine. She was born in St. John, New Brunswick on August 12, 1836. She was married to John H. Rogers. She died in Gloucester on September 12, 1910.
5. Margaret Grant Brown Simpson was the daughter of Alexander and Catherine. She was born in 1844 in New Brunswick and married John Brown on June 6, 1861. After his death she married Edward Simpson on October 12, 1893. Like her sister, Mary, she lost her husband and child. She died in Gloucester on March 13, 1921.
6. Mary A. Grant Low was the daughter of Alexander and Catherine. She was born in 1834 in Cape Breton, Nova Scotia and married Benjamin Low on April 2, 1860. She died in Rockport on December 29, 1907 and left her estate to her sister, Margaret Simpson. Her life was marked by the double tragedy of losing her husband to the sea and her little boy, Thomas to brain disease.
7. Benjamin Low is probably not buried in Clark's because he was lost at sea in March of 1864 on the "R E Spofford". His name is on the monument with his wife and child. He was the son of Stephen and Sarah Low and was born in 1828.
8. Thomas Sweet Low was the son of Mary A. and Benjamin Low. He was born in Gloucester on September 4, 1861. He died of brain disease on September 17, 1867 in Gloucester.

9. John Brown was born in Sweden in 1836, the son of James and Hannah. He died in Gloucester on August 17, 1862.
10. Nellie Brown was the daughter of John and Margaret Brown. She was born in 1861 and died in Gloucester on October 27, 1862. The death record is difficult to read, but it appears that she died from burns and hemorrhage and that she suffered for three weeks. Nellie was a nickname. Her real name was Mary L. Brown.
11. John A. Grant was the son of Alexander Grant and Catherine Carmichael. He was born in 1844 and died in Gloucester on November 30, 1911.
