Jacob Karcher is the name on the plot map. There are two good monuments in this plot.

1. Jacob Karcher was born in Germany on April 1, 1834. He was the son of Daniel Karcher and Christine Webber. He married Elizabeth McRae in Gloucester on December 9, 1856. He worked as a baker. He died in Gloucester on March 6, 1893. He was a diabetic and got gangrene from a bruise on his foot.
2. Elizabeth McRae Karcher was the daughter of Christina Nicholson and Daniel McRae. Some records say she was born in Cape Breton, some say Nova Scotia and some say Scotland. She was born in 1835 and died in Gloucester on May 23, 1897.
3. Frederick D. Karcher was the son of Jacob and Elizabeth. He was born in Gloucester on January 30, 1863 according to his Mason membership card. The interesting thing is that there is a birth record for Frederick on March 8, 1869. This can't be right and all other records indicate he was born in 1863. He married Margaret S. Kennedy in Gloucester on September 2, 1886. He died of an accidental overdose of Laudanum on November 25, 1899.
4. Margaret S. Kennedy Karcher was born in Gloucester in January of 1868. She was the daughter of Patrick Kennedy and Mary Tracy. She died of consumption in Gloucester on Dec 8, 1911.
5. Margaret E. Karcher was the daughter of Frederick and Margaret. She was born in Gloucester in 1890 and died of consumption a few months before her mother on March 26, 1911.
6. Charles C. Karcher was the son of Jacob Karcher and Elizabeth McRae. He was born in Gloucester on March 8, 1869 and died there on February 11, 1872.
7. Jacob Karcher was the son of Jacob and Elizabeth. He was born in Gloucester in October of 1857 and died there on December 27, 1864.
8. Christina Nicholson McRae was the daughter of Angus Nicholson and the wife of Daniel McRae. She was born in Scotland in 1802 and lived a long life. She died in Gloucester on April 4, 1898. She was the mother of Elizabeth Karcher and Jennie McRae who is listed below.
9. Jennie McRae was born in Cape Breton in 1836. She was the daughter of Christina and Daniel McRae. She died of consumption in Gloucester on July 8, 1884.
